In modern times, a "fairy tale ending" refers to a happy ending, though there are examples of fairy tales that do not end happily.

In cultures where demonds and witches are seen as real, fairy tales are told as legends having historical actuality as in epics like the Iliad or the Odyssey. However, they usually do not contain reference to religion,

actual places, persons and events, they take place "Once upon a time" rather than in actual times.

This history of fairy tales is particularly difficult to trace, because only their literary forms have survived. Still, the evidence of literary words at least shows that fairy tales have existed for thousands of years. The name 'fairy tale' was first given to them by Madame d' Aulnoy.
